

MAPLE Twins

These 15 cm Double-ended Crochet Hooks cater for Tunisian Crocheters and have been added to the range of MAPLE wood needles to satisfy the demand for making smaller projects in Tunisian Crochet. They come in a set of five and can also be ordered individually from sizes 3 mm to 10 mm.

Safety stitch markers

are cleverly designed to slip onto your stitches and can be locked, like safety pins, to keep the markersin place.



Wool Needles

We recommend the aluminium PONY wool needle for sewing up knitted pieces and tidying up loose ends. The flexible nylon loop is ideal, even for threading thicker yarns. Available in a set of 3 sizes.

It's as simple as that:



With A, chain 28. Ss to join, taking care not to twist the chains. Mark the last stitch with a stitch marker. Round 1: Start the forward pass by inserting the hook into one loop of the chain (use the same part of the chain for each stitch), yarn over, draw loop through, leaving loop on the hook.



Yarn over and pull through two loops (one of B and one of A).



Round 2 to 6: Repeat round 1, but this time for the FP insert hook into the upper horizontal bar (in colour B) instead of picking up the chain stitch.



Pull yarn through remaining 6-8 stitches, pull through the last loop on the hook. Pull the working yarn to the inside and sew in ends using a PONY wool needle.



Continue to pick up loops in this way until you have roughly 1/3 of the stitches on the hook.

Turn the work and slide the work to the opposite hook. To start the return pass, make a loop with B.



Continue to yarn over and pull through two loops until just one stitch of the FP and one of the RP remain on the hook. Turn the work. Continue the FP with A by picking up loops until you reach the marker. Work stitch where marker is, move marker to the stitch you just completed.



Round 7: Decreasing starts – decrease 4 times 2 stitches in each of the next RPs (by pulling colour B through two loops) until only 6-8 stitches are left



Pull the loop through the first loop on the hook (pulling through one loop is only necessary for the first round).



Turn the work. Continue the RP with B – yarn over and pull through two loops until just one loop of FP and one of RP are on the hook. Turn the work. One round complete.
